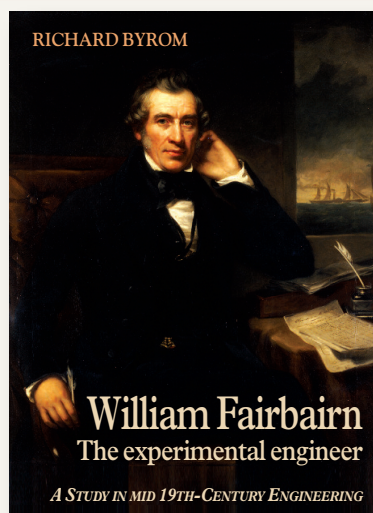

William Fairbairn the experimental engineer by Richard Byrom

William Fairbairn (1789–1874) was one of the greatest of 19th-century engineers yet is strangely overlooked. This is the first definitive biography for 140 years. It covers his many achievements as the leading experimental engineer in the middle quarters of the 19th century, including:

- Building some 500 railway locomotives;
- Constructing over 1,000 iron railway bridges, including the first on a main-line railway (the Liverpool & Manchester), and the research for the Britannia and Conway tubular bridges;
- Experimental work on canal boats, leading him to advise that canals could not compete with railways for passengers;
- Invention of the tubular crane, one of which was the most powerful crane of its day and another the prototype of the railway breakdown crane;
- Building early iron steamships, including the *Iron Duke* – the first to cross the Atlantic.

Fully researched and profusely illustrated, the book will appeal to all with an interest in engineering history: academics and non-academics alike.

Rails in the Dales

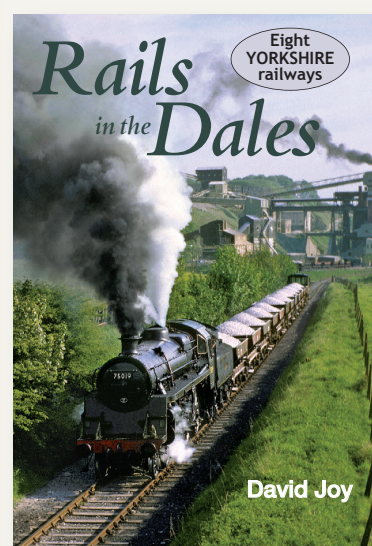

Covers railways in the magnificent setting of the main Yorkshire dales – Wharfedale, Ribblesdale, Swaledale, Wensleydale and Nidderdale. For the first time there is an overall chronological account, which shows how a diverse range of lines evolved and the affect they had on the communities they served.

The Settle–Carlisle receives due attention but its cult status does not dominate these pages. The aim is an overall picture, ranging from such highlights as arguably Britain’s finest branch line terminus at Richmond through to the remarkable Nidd Valley Light Railway built to help solve a water crisis in distant Bradford.

Photographs capture the essence of rails in the dales and especially the lines that had gone long before the Beeching age.
